

Let's Talk Plants

Don't worry so much!

- Anything is better than just grass.
- You will kill some things.
- Plants don't have to have long lives (in the home landscape!). You buy pansies...it is ok to buy shorter lived perennials.
- You will mess up. (And then you will move things or kill them)
- Watch the moisture, soil and sun needs.
- Start small.
- COVER THE GROUND. Think Layers.
- Don't bury sun-loving native plants in mulch!










