The project

Aldersgate United Methodist Church is beginning the third year of a collaborative project to renovate its 1.9 acres of green space to benefit the environment and **serve the neighborhood**. A seminar on sustainable landscaping inspired us to transform a standard project with foundation plantings into something much more ambitious. The vision is an intensively landscaped park with an abundance of plants for wildlife habitat that offers solace through nature for visitors. Streets and sidewalks on three sides of the property provide easy public access. **Nature-based play** for children is a key aspect of the vision. When completed, Aldersgate Gardens will serve as an example of sustainable landscaping and a nature-based playground.
