

Royale Oaks / House of Hope (ROHOH) Assisted Living and Memory Care, a nine acre property located at 4801 N 52nd Street in Omaha Nebraska

The project

This project was part of an ongoing restoration and rejuvenation of the landscape of Royale Oaks / House of Hope, a long-term care community in Northeast Omaha. The goal is to design and install a landscape **that goes beyond beauty** to perform a service that enhances the wellbeing of residents, staff and the community surrounding the property. The rejuvenation includes new foundation plantings throughout the property, an updated tree plan for the property, creating a park-like setting, and themed plantings to beckon residents to the outdoors. The landscape design embraces the unique characteristics of long-term care communities; best practices for **sustainability and low management**; multi season color and interest; therapeutic principles such as color, movement, texture and smell; and **attraction of wildlife** (birds, butterflies, etc.) to the landscape. By viewing the landscape in zones, designer Jane English considers what residents will see from their windows as well as what they will experience when spending time in the gardens. Accessibility is key, ensuring that walkways welcome residents with different levels of mobility and seating is abundant on patios and in gazebos. The goal of this landscape is not just to improve the view but to encourage residents to become active participants in the life of the landscape- asking questions, touching, smelling, and observing birds and insects.

What we learned

- 1 Dream big and have the patience to plan, fund and budget for the longterm.
- 2 Focus the design on the users of the spaces and be intentional.


